
WIFILM ACT Curriculum *Writer* Tip-Sheet









Take a class

• This can help you to learn more about the fundamentals of screenwriting.



Read Scripts

• Why not create a list of your favourite films or TV shows and read the scripts. This can act as a guide when writing your own screenplay.



Watch, watch watch!

• Find films or TV shows that are similar to the genre you want to write. This can help you to develop ideas for your own screenplay.



Show, don't tell!

• Show the action, don't tell it! As a writer, you will need to consider and describe the visual elements indicated in your script.

Create a writing routine

• Having a routine will help you to dedicate time to work on your script, and help you to set goals that you can achieve.



Find other screen writers

• Look for other people who are interested in writing. This will allow you to find a community of like-minded people who you can network with.



Draft, draft and draft again!

• Your first script might not be as great as you'd hoped. Don't be afraid to keep drafting your work until you are happy with it!
